Troup County's Vegetative Debris Disposal Protocol

Troup County, Ga. January 13, 2023 – Troup County Government would like to extend sincere appreciation to our citizens for the strength, compassion, and bravery they have shown our community in the aftermath of yesterday's severe weather. However, please be advised that there is no case in which civilians should move debris onto roads' right-of-ways.

For citizens looking for ways to dispose of unwanted vegetative debris, the County encourages composting or controlled burning on personal property. For those who insist on hauling any debris off, DO NOT take it to the right-of-ways or the Troup County Convenience Centers. You may instead take the vegetative debris to the C&D Landfill located at 174 Parmer Rd. in LaGrange.

In an effort to maximize convenience for our citizens, the Landfill will temporarily extend their operating hours for this event to help handle this waste stream.

Monday – Friday: 7am – 5pm
Saturday, January 14th: 7am – 5pm
Saturday, January 21st & 28th: 7am – 2pm

We would like to thank all citizens for their cooperation as we navigate these trying times together.
