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Troup County Recommends Changes to the Board of Elections

Troup County, Ga. January 20, 2021– The Troup County Board of Commissioners voted unanimously at its meeting last night to the recommended revisions to the composition of the Board of Election to create a fair, bipartisan board to effectively represent all citizens of Troup County.

The Troup County Board of Elections and Registration will now consist of (5) members to be appointed by a majority vote of the Board Commissioners of Troup County. One member serving as the chairperson of the board and the other four members elected by a majority vote of the Board of Commissioner representing the district they serve. The member designated as chairperson will serve for an initial term of three years, and the appointed members in Commission District 2 and 3 will serve an initial term of two years, and the members residing in Commission District 4 and 5 will serve for an initial term of one year.

This resolution will be effective for purposes of making initial appointments upon the approval of the Governor or upon the date which this Act becomes the law without his approval and shall become fully effective January 1, 2022.

"We are looking to form a bipartisan board with a real representation of Troup County's diverse demographics and culture, but also to ensure we are efficiently exhibiting fairness across the voting process." Eric Mosley, Troup County Manager said.

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
