

**PUBLIC COMMENTS FROM 6-26-07 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN MEETING  
AT TROUP COUNTY COURTHOUSE**

| Roads are being widened near National Register properties. ( <i>The Georgia Department of Transportation does an environmental assessment on every road widening project and a requirement of that is to locate any historic properties and avoid National Register properties</i> ). |
| County needs to protect historic resources in County.   |
